SUMMARY.

Patrick Lawrence is a columnist, author, editor, and educator. He has published five books and currently writes foreign affairs commentary for *The Nation* and other publications. He served as a correspondent abroad for many years and is also an essayist and critic. He has taught at universities in the U.S. and abroad and co-authored a journalism textbook.

A journalist for more than four decades, Lawrence was a correspondent and subsequently a columnist overseas for more than twenty years, chiefly for the *Far Eastern Economic Review*, the *International Herald Tribune*, and *The New Yorker*. He has won two Overseas Press Club Awards as well as other honors and prizes. His reportage, commentary, essays, criticism, and reviews have appeared in *The New York Times*, *Business Week*, *TIME*, *The Washington Quarterly*, *World Policy Journal*, *The Globalist*, *The Nation*, and numerous other publications.

Lawrence edited the *Herald Tribune's* Asian edition before returning to the United States, in 2010. *Time No Longer: Americans After the American Century*, his most recent book, was published by Yale University Press in 2013. He is now working on his sixth book.
